Dear Catholic Monarch Family,

These past few days have been a whirlwind of information about the Coronavirus from the CDC, the Diocese of Richmond, and Old Dominion University. I know that we are all being bombarded with emails from every place we have ever shared our email address with, but I wanted to send out a message about how Catholic Campus Ministry at Old Dominion University will proceed in the coming weeks.

ODU has announced the following:

- Spring Break has been extended for one week March 16 March 20
- All classes will resume online on Monday, March 23 and will continue as such until further notice.
- The University is closed this week (March 16-20), including the Webb Center, Perry Library, Barry Art Museum, Gordon Art Galleries and the Student Recreation Center.
- The University has cancelled all university events and we are prohibiting any student organization events and gatherings both on and off campus. This includes any meetings of organizations, events, parties, community service or any other activities affiliated with your organizations. Additionally, all student organization travel is suspended until further notice. This prohibition applies to all student organizations.

The Diocese of Richmond has announced the following:

- Bishop Knestout directed the temporary suspension of all public Masses within the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, including Sunday, Holy Day, and weekday Masses.
- Until further notice, Bishop Knestout has granted a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days for all the faithful in the Catholic Diocese of Richmond.
- Bishop Knestout will livestream private celebrations of Sunday Masses for the foreseeable future.
